What would our community do without Bona Vista Programs Inc. or organizations like us across the State? Bona Vista serves 2,000 children and adults daily. We communicate with parents, guardians, foster care,

advocates, physicians, attorneys and educators to make sure fair and meaningful services are provided.

The agency is open and available for services 365 days a year, around the clock. If an emergency arises in the middle of the night, we respond immediately. For many of the adults that we serve in Residential and Supported Living Services, we are the consumer's family, there is no one else in their lives. Other consumers are blessed with loving and involved families, but those numbers are small.

Bona Vista covers everything from basic needs to extreme health care issues without hesitation. Without the services of Bona Vista a very large population would add to the city's homeless population or end up in the corrections system, neither of which are good options. We are all aware of the fact that mental health services are not readily available in the community and it is a critical issue that is not going to improve. Bona Vista has

gone to great efforts to assure that the people that we serve do get the services they need and are provided a strong continuum of care.

Bona Vista is involved in several housing projects to assure that those in our care are offered the opportunity to reside in a clean and safe environment. Too often individuals in the community take advantage of the people that we serve and Bona Vista steps in to protect and advocate for support. There are many details about Bona Vista that community members never think about! The organization provides an array of services that touches so many people's lives.

Bona Vista is also getting ready to rebuild the facility that was lost in the tornado of 2013, it has been a project in the making for quite some time. We have finally made it to the build phase and are ready to put an attractive and very functional building on the corner of Plate and Hoffer. This building will become the new home for our Community Connections Program as well as many group and individual Habilitation opportunities. We thank you all for your continued support through this phase of our organization, you all contribute to the positive result.

Early Head Start (EHS) serves expectant mothers and children ages birth to three years throughout Howard and Miami Counties. Taking a proactive, family-centered approach, Early Head Start offers center or home-based child care and family development programming free of charge to those who meet the income requirements. EHS served 25 pregnant women and 142 children in 2014.

Keys for Kids Preschool provides services and support to children and their families through an individualized program that will maximize potential, encourage independence, promote inclusion and improve the quality of life for those children and their families. Keys for Kids Preschool, is available for children of ALL ABILITIES. Preschool services at Bona Vista are not only for children with special needs. We pride ourselves on providing a program for special needs, typical education, and half and full day programs to children ages two through five years. In 2014 Keys for Kids Preschool served 364 students from 2 through 5 years of age in Howard and Miami Counties.



Child Care Solutions (CCS) offers education, assistance and mentoring to child care providers in many settings including regulated and licensed child care providers who seek to provide quality care to children through an 11-county wide area. In 2014 CCS provided 296 trainings to 2,495 parents, child care providers and community partners on the topics of child development and health and safety. CCS helped 912 families find quality child care enabling parents to work and/or attend school knowing their children were well cared for in a safe environment.

Positive Results For Kids continues to provide pediatric services in the areas of developmental, occupational, physical and speech language therapies in Howard and Miami counties. Thanks to help from United Way funding, we also provide free developmental screenings to children from birth to 5 years of age in both Howard and Miami counties. In 2014 Positive Results For Kids served 367 children.

Adult Services

Bona Vista Industries (BVI) provides vocational and life experiences to adults with disabilities in an integrated industrial setting. BVI is able to provide these experiences through sub-contract services with area, regional and federal businesses and organizations as well as with group habilitation. In 2014, BVI served 286 adults with disabilities in our Kokomo and Peru work facilities.

WorkForce Diversity, the Vocational Services division of Bona Vista Programs, serves Howard County and surrounding counties. WorkForce Diversity provides services through Vocational Rehabilitation, Ticket to Work, Access to Recovery, benefits counseling, Career Scope, job shadowing and supported employment follow-along services. In 2014 WorkForce Diversity successfully placed 77 clients in community jobs. Work Force Diversity also completed 39 benefit plans for Vocational Rehabilitation.

Supported Living Services (SLS) provides residential support in the home of the person served. Supported Living Services are provided for as little as one hour a week and up to 24 hours a day. While receiving SLS, a person served works on individualized goals that are developed during the individual's team

meeting. Supported Living goals range from daily living skills, residential management, budgeting and shopping, community integration, financial management and management of medical needs. The Supported Living program served 66 individuals in 2014. Out of 42 sites, 16 sites require 24 hour support.

On November 17, 2013, a tornado ripped through the center of Kokomo, Indiana. Among the destroyed and severely damaged buildings was the Imagine That! Innovation Center building that housed various children's programs for Bona Vista Programs, Inc. The building, at 1800 S. Plate, that housed the children's programs was insured but the insurance proceeds will not pay for the new replacement structure. We need your assistance in completing the project. The construction of a \$1.1 million building project that can accommodate the many unique requirements of a facility designed for intellectually, developmentally delayed and physically challenged individuals will cost significantly more than the insurance proceeds. We need an additional \$500,000 to complete our vision.

Since the tornado, the children's programs have been moved to another building operated by Bona Vista Programs. In the quest for optimum efficiency, it has been decided to relocate another vital program within the Bona Vista

family of services to the newly re-constructed building.

The new building has been designed to accommodate the Bona Vista Community Connections Program. Community Connections is a day program with thirty individuals who are physically unable to care for themselves. Some cannot feed themselves independently, toilet themselves alone or socialize without close supervision due to their physical and intellectual limitations. The Community Connections Program receives minimal governmental funding and

is entirely dependent on our community partners for its financial support.

The lives of thirty adults struggling to deal with the basic necessities of life are dependent on our ability to raise the \$500,000 necessary to build and equip a facility addressing their unique needs. The population of adults requiring this vital program is growing and must have the additional space and functional design to enable its continued success. Bona Vista Programs' Residential Services served 64 clients in 2014 through eight group living sites in Howard and Miami counties, 8 individuals live in each home. Clients in Residential Services require 24-hour care to increase their skills in areas such as decision making, socialization, personal care, various aspects of maintaining/operating a household, managing finances and safety needs. Increasing independence in these areas not only promotes a higher independence for clients, but also creates the opportunity to progress into other service areas provided by Bona Vista Programs, such as Supported Living Services and/ or Work Services.



Community Based Habilitation - Individual (CHIO) Services Program is a goal based program that includes services outside of the individual's home that support learning and assistance in the areas of: selfcare, sensory/motor development, socialization, daily living skills, communication, community living and social skills. Individual Community Based Habilitation Services are provided in as little as three hours a week. In 2014, 54 people were served through Individual Community Based Habilitation Services.

Community Connections is a structured day program for adults with severe intellectual disabilities. Programming provides training in daily living skills and includes, but is not limited to, areas of cooking, academics, current events, exercise and music. Opportunities are also provided for community integration through volunteer opportunities or leisure activities of the clients' choice. In 2014 the Community Connections program served 33 individuals in Kokomo and 9 individuals in Peru.

Habilitation Services provides individual and group training classes to adults with disabilities. Various classes can range from educational or computer skills to independent living, appropriate social behaviors and personal daily living skills. The Habilitation department provides instruction ranging from number recognition to preparing individuals to earn their GED with no time limit on when goals have to be met. In 2014 Habilitation services provided training to 201 people in Kokomo and Peru.
