Training Titles	Training Descriptions and Age Group Focus
<b>The Performers: Understanding and Supporting Children's Development, CDA Quarter 3</b>	This quarter will focus on developing participants strategies to support children's creativity, sense of self and social emotional development. Participants must commit to attending all 4 sessions in this series. (Infant/Toddler, Preschool)
<b>Webinar: Outdoor Health and Safety</b>	Summer has arrived! It's time to make sure that your outdoor environment is ready for lots of play. This webinar will help you prepare for your outdoor environment to ensure that it is safe for the children. Registration is needed a minimum of 48 business hours in advance of the webinar. (Infant/Toddler, Preschool, School Age)
<b>D.A.P.P.: Developmentally Appropriate Pinterest Projects</b>  <b>Infant/Toddler, Preschool or School Age</b>	Developmentally Appropriate Pinterest Projects. Do you spend time searching Pinterest for activity ideas? How do you determine which projects are classroom worthy? In this session, we will explore searching for Pinterest projects, making modifications, and connecting the Foundations. We are offering several versions of this training, find the one that best fits your needs or attend them all: Infant Toddler, Preschool or School Age. This session comes with onsite technical assistance to complete the training hours. (Infant/Toddler, Preschool, School Age)
<b>Wednesday Webinar Series:</b> ●Engaging, Meaningful Experiences ●Plan Ahead ●Stretch! ●Time to Stop ●Talkity Talk ●What did we learn today?	This webinar series will support you in making intentional & meaningful connections throughout your day while interacting with the children. We will explore using language and questions effectively to expand exploration and knowledge. We will look at planning engaging & meaningful experiences and how timing impacts those experiences. While participants are encouraged to participate in all 6 webinars, single webinar participation is permitted. Participants are also eligible for technical assistance after. (Preschool, School Age)
<b>Webinar: Why are you so sad? Helping children handle grief.</b>	This webinar will discuss grief, as children may experience it, and explore strategies to help children navigate grief. (Infant/Toddler, Preschool, School Age)
<b>Picky Eater's Rehab</b>	This session explores some basic nutritional concepts, family style dining and strategies to support your picky eaters in trying new foods. As a bonus, participants are eligible for onsite technical assistance to implement cooking activities with their kids. Join us as we explore how to implement cooking with kids in your program and how to capitalize on the learning opportunities. (Infant/Toddler, Preschool, School Age)
<b>The Musical Child</b>	Join us for this interactive session exploring why music is so vital to the growth and learning of young children and how to incorporate music into your teaching. (Infant/Toddler, Preschool)
<b>Strategies for Supporting Speech and Language Development in Infants and Toddlers</b>	Teaching infants and toddlers speech and language skills can be challenging. Learn how teachers can provide purposeful speech and language interactions and experiences for the youngest learners (Infant/Toddler)
<b>Ouch Biting Hurts, What Are They Trying to Tell Us?</b>	Participants will learn about the possible reasons why children bite, strategies that will decrease this behavior and how to work with families (Infant/Toddler)
<b>Hero's Story Time</b>	HERO'S: Helping Everyone Reach Optimum Success. Developed surrounding eight books, participants will walk away empowered to take their story time to the next level. Each of the eight titles gives an opportunity for teachers to focus on one of the 40 Developmental Assets. Participants will explore strategies to help children build skills that support their social emotional development and developing preventative factors regarding abuse. The training is free. However, if participants want their own set of the eight books, there is a \$20 cost. (Preschool)
<b>Won't You Be My Neighbor: Building Relationships</b>	The participants will learn to develop better relationships with the families and children they serve. (Infant/Toddler, Preschool, School Age)
<b>School Age Child Development Module 4 (INHS)</b>	During the school-age years, the brain continues to undergo changes and develop - socially, emotionally, physically, and cognitively. Caregivers and teachers are in a unique position to provide a variety of experiences that support all areas of development. This course addresses the basic principles of development for school-age children and implications for learning environments. 11.Major domains of Child Development (recommended) (School Age)
<b>Paths to QUALITY™ Introduction Session</b>	The Paths to QUALITY™ Introduction Session is designed to provide child care providers with all the information they will need in order to participate in Indiana's quality rating and improvement system. You will learn about the four levels of participation, the enrollment process, coaching options, rater visits, incentives, and awards.
<b>Orientation I-Overview for participants who are interested in starting the business of child care</b>	This child care start-up workshop provides an overview for participants who are interested in starting the business of child care in a home, center, or ministry setting, and is the first part of a two-part series. It covers regulatory requirements, resources, and some information on health, safety and business practices. It serves to help participants with the decision-making process for choosing which type of care they would like to provide.
<b>Child Abuse and Neglect Detection and Prevention</b>	Created by the FSSA, Bureau of Childcare's Health Consultants, this one hour training provides participants with information on the prevalence of abuse and neglect, causes and prevention of abuse and neglect, and how to report abuse and neglect. This training will meet the standard for completing Child Abuse Detection and Prevention training as required by Indiana law for Unlicensed CCDF providers as well as any other child care providers who are required to complete the training.
<b>Orientation II-A requirement for family child care providers to become licensed</b>	Preparation for Home Child Care Licensure is the 2nd training in this two- part series designed to outline regulatory requirements, licensing steps and resources for providing licensed child care in a home environment. You will leave this training prepared to take the next steps to licensing your home and will receive the necessary paperwork.
<b>Safe Sleeping Practices and Reducing the Risk of SIDS in Child Care</b>	Participants will increase their understanding of a safe sleeping environment for infants from newborn to twelve months of age. Focus will be on creating a safe and healthy sleeping area, risk reduction strategies for Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS), and accidental death prevention. This training is a pre-service requirement that satisfies Public Law 162-205 for home licensure, as well as Provider Eligibility Standards Certified home providers (CCDF Voucher). Child care providers from all settings are encouraged to attend this free training. (Infant/Toddler)

### [On My Way Pre-K Expansion](#)

Governor Eric J. Holcomb and the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) announced that 15 additional Indiana counties are now eligible to participate in On My Way Pre-K, making prekindergarten available in 2018 to 4-year-olds from low-income families in those counties. Earlier this year, the Indiana General Assembly expanded the program from five pilot counties to 20 counties in House Enrolled Act (HEA) 1004-2017.

The new counties added to the On My Way Pre-K program are Bartholomew, DeKalb, Delaware, Elkhart, Floyd, **Grant**, Harrison, **Howard**, Kosciusko, Madison, Marshall, Monroe, St. Joseph, Tippecanoe and Vigo.
