Vista invests considerable training time instructing staff members in a variety of areas such as medication administration, learning about the various types of medications, documentation requirements, learning how to track daily notes and goals, learning CPR, behavior management techniques, risk plan management, daily living skills and goal attainment and how to work with co-workers. Skills learned in this position can be applied in all levels of employment as one grows professionally within Bona Vista!

CONSTRUCTION = PERFECTION

Bona Vista's Crossing building, 1221 S. Plate St., has been getting a facelift – inside and out! This renovation will provide Bona Vista the opportunity to expand our adult day program options into a previously vacant 27,000 square foot manufacturing facility.





"With the shift in the manufacturing programming within our industry, we have this unoccupied space that can now be used in a different, more efficient way within our services to benefit the community and those with disabilities," stated Brianne Boles, CEO/President, Bona Vista Programs.

The new layout will include a gym/recreational area, a sensory room, an art creation room, an art gallery that will be open to the community, a computer room and three additional classrooms that will house programs that will focus on learning daily living skills and habilitation to help individuals

with disabilities live and thrive in the community.

The additional space created by the movement of the Adult Day Programs into the new area will also allow Bona Vista to expand one program of their WorkForce Diversity community employment services. The build will incorporate a nice space for the Pre-Employment Transition Services as additional options for transition age youth 14-22 years.
