

Therapy is Our Specialty

specializes in pediatric physical, occupational, speech and developmental therapies. Currently, we offer outpatient, school based and Indiana First Steps

Our outpatient clinic offers physical and occupational therapies. Our therapists, who are state licensed specialize in evaluation, treating and caring for patients ages birth to 18 years. They treat conditions related to minimal to severe genetic, neurological and

orthopedic disorders, prematurity as well as developmental delays. Our therapists focus on family engagement and providing parent education and support. We accept Medicaid and private insurance

Our Keys for Kids Early Education Center contracts with the following schools for pediatric therapies: Kokomo, Taylor, Western, Northwestern, Eastern and Tipton. The children enrolled in these school corporations have an Individualized Education Plan that allows them the opportunity to attend Keys for Kids Preschool and receive either physical, occupational and/or speech therapies.

Indiana First Steps is an early intervention program designed to provide physical. occupational, speech and developmental therapies to children birth to three years of age. The therapies are received in a natural environment such as the child's home. preschool or childcare. Currently, Bona Vista sees 101 children in Howard, Miami and

Our staff of 15 therapists consists of two physical therapists, four occupational therapists, two speech therapists, one certified occupational therapy assistant, and

five developmental therapists. We are a team that works together to make sure that your child is receiving the best, high quality pediatric care that you can find in Central Indiana.

We are currently working on a Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) Clinic that will debut in early 2018. If you are not familiar with NAS, it is a group of conditions that occur in a newborn who was exposed to addictive opiate drugs while in the mother's womb. All too often, we receive referrals linked to NAS, and we want to educate parents, guardians and loved ones how to cope with possible conditions related to NAS. The clinic will be led by our therapists, and there will be plenty of opportunity to interact and ask questions with our professionals. Please stay tuned for the official date!
